

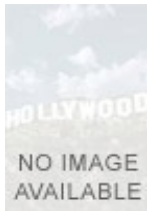

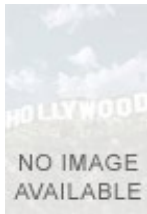


[Freedom Road](#)

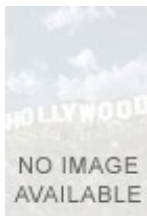
### [21 Hours at Munich](#)

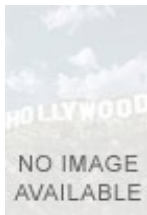
